Hand Hygiene	<p>Choose at least one category:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Increase number of observers for Clean In, Clean Out Increase number of observations for Clean In, Clean Out Improve compliance with Clean In, Clean Out 	<p>Examples:</p> <p>Increase from 25 observers per month to 50.</p> <p>Increase from 200 observations per month to 350.</p> <p>Improve compliance from 85 to 90%.</p>	<p>Improving Participation Examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Communicate expectation for each staff member to complete at least 5 observations each month Educate staff on methods for data collection Managers/supervisors to perform observations (role model) Manager/leaders/supervisors to assign staff member (RN, resident MD, HUC) to perform daily observations Staff use a "tag" strategy – once they have completed 5 observations, pass the observation tool to coworker Borrow iPod Touch from Hosp Epi for iScrub observations Hospital Epidemiology/Mentor Hand Hygiene advisory committee attend staff meeting <p>Improving Compliance Examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure area is assessed for easy access to hand rubs and/or soap and water. Provide positive feedback when desired behavior is observed Share info about campaign (hospital goal, observations, current data for area) at huddles, staff meetings, multidisciplinary meetings with Triad Leaders. Be creative and find ways to recognize staff ----incentives for participation and compliance. Share info in designated bulletin board area (tools, graphs, data). Track observation data on graph in unit/department. Conduct Road Shows/Fairs on Clean In, Clean Out 	<p>Examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attending physicians will assign a resident to do 10 observations each day.
